GOSPEL REFLECTION FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT - MARCH 9, 2025

Every year, we follow Jesus' example and go into the desert for forty days during Lent. What is the desert? It is a place that is empty, where life is almost impossible to sustain. It is a place where there are no distractions, where we are away from everything that we are accustomed to and familiar with. Most of us will not go into a literal desert this Lent. But, if we are going to live these forty days well, we will have to break with our routine, go out of our comfort zone, and do something that makes us uneasy.

For each of us, that desert will be a different place. It could be volunteering at a homeless shelter or soup kitchen. Even though there is a lot of activity in those places, it might bring us into contact with people we would normally try to avoid. It might bring up prejudices and fears that we wouldn't otherwise see in ourselves.

Another "desert" might be somewhere quiet, away from all the noise around us. Sitting in the quiet -whether it's in a church or outside somewhere - can force us to face some uncomfortable and painful feelings. Often, when we settle ourselves down, emotions like anger or resentment come bursting to the surface. Without anything to distract our attention away from them, we have no choice but to recognize them and deal with them.

For some people, a desert could be picking up a spiritual book and reading it carefully. Reading can be one of the most dangerous things we can do. It can challenge us to look at ourselves differently and to make some real changes. That is certainly true about reading the Bible. If reading the Bible is something you haven't done much of, this Lent might be a good time to dive into it and see where the pages take you. There are also many books by the saints and other Catholic authors that can enrich our prayer and challenge us to look at our attitudes and behaviors in new ways.

For each of us, the desert will be a different place. But we must allow God's Holy Spirit to lead us there, as He did Jesus. Because it is there, in a place that seems to be lifeless, that we discover what is really important. It is there, where nothing can distract us, that we can focus on the deepest longing of our heart - friendship with God.

When we go into our own personal desert, we have to do it with the same attitude Jesus had. He had total, unconditional trust in His Father's goodness and love. We see it right at the beginning of today's gospel when Jesus allows the Holy Spirit to lead Him to a place where He would be hungry, alone, and susceptible to the devil's temptations. Jesus doesn't complain about it or try to put it off. Rather, He is totally obedient to His Father's will. He goes where the Spirit leads Him, even though it will require sacrifice and pain.

And it is because of that total trust in His Father's goodness and love that Jesus can withstand the devil's temptations. The devil is always trying to convince us that God has forgotten about us. He wants us to believe that God is distant and that He doesn't care. That is how He got our first parents - Adam and Eve - to fall. And He tries to do the same with Jesus. That is why He takes Him to the roof of the Temple in Jerusalem and tells Him to throw Himself off. In a sense, He is saying to Jesus, "Prove that God really loves you. Prove that God will really save you." But Jesus doesn't need to prove God's loving care for Him, either to Himself or to the devil. He is convinced of it, even when He is hungry and alone.

Whatever desert we choose to enter this Lent, we must go into it with the same love and trust that Jesus had. God is good. He loves us and will never abandon us. So, when we go to a shelter and a homeless person insults us or a fellow volunteer treats us rudely, we don't give up because we know God is with us. When we go to a quiet place and painful emotions start welling up within us and we can't focus on prayer, we stay put and do our best because we are convinced that God hears us. Or when we read the Bible and can't make any sense of it or if it is calling us to a change that we don't believe we can make, we accept the confusion knowing that God will use that to transform our hearts.



Lent & the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, OCIA

OCIA classes are not simply for people taking a course on the truths of the Catholic Church. It's a journey of discovering Jesus Christ is Emmanuel, God with us, it's a call to

new life & personal conversion to Jesus Christ in faith & love, & it's welcoming participants to experience & grow closer to our Triune God in the full Christian sacramental life of the Catholic Church. It's preparing people for receiving the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation & First Holy Communion celebrated at the Easter Vigil Mass, April 19. The OCIA participants are completing their period of preparation & are entering into Lent on Ash Wednesday, proclaiming the death & resurrection of the Lord, the Savior of the world. Lent is an intense 6-week spiritual retreat, called the Period of Purification and Enlightenment. In this period, they will pray more, hear the Gospel, fast, do scrutiny prayers, do penance for sins, & do charitable works. The Rite of Election of Catechumens (unbaptized) & Call to Continuing Conversion of Candidates (baptized Catholics or in another Christian denomination but who have not been confirmed or received the Eucharist) takes place each year on the First Sunday of Lent. The celebration of the rite has two parts: First, the Rite of Sending at each parish; in the ceremony the catechumens, candidates, publicly express to their parish that they believe God has called them to the Catholic faith & desire the Sacraments of Initiation. We, the Church, the family of God, accept the responsibility to pray for & support our brothers & sisters along their Lenten faith journey, to pray, fast & do works of charity with them. We are called to welcome them & to witness to them our faith & prepare ourselves for the renewal of our own Baptismal grace at Easter. Father Mayer & our parish family pray for, recommend & send the OCIA candidates to Bishop Frank J. Dewane, Shepherd of the Diocese of Venice. In the 2nd part, is the Rite of Election, the candidates, their sponsors & families go to Our Lady of Light Catholic Church. In the Rite of Election, the Bishop speaks for the Church in the name of Christ & acknowledges that they have been chosen (elected) by God & called by Christ. Bishop Dewane accepts them as candidates for the Easter Sacraments & assures the candidates of his & the Church's loving support.

Our Pastor, Father Mayer & our parish will celebrate the <u>Sacraments of Initiation</u> & our Elect will become full members & receive our risen Lord & brother in Holy Communion during the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday, April 19, 8:30pm, at St. Francis of Assisi Church. Congratulations in your initiation into Catholic Christian life & worship! Following Christ leads to God's generous blessings & eternal life!

REGULATIONS ON FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025, and Good Friday, April 18, 2025, are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 years and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is to continue until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.




