

Walking with Jesus

Today's Gospel goes further than just asking us to understand why the glory of Jesus our King and Lord was to be found through suffering and the shameful death of the Cross. There is a further call for us to walk the same road with Jesus: "If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me."

Jesus is asking each one of <u>us</u> to dedicate our lives in totally loving and serving others even, if at times, this involves misunderstanding, ridicule, pain and even death itself.

It would be altogether wrong to think that Jesus is asking us to lead miserable lives in order to be good Christians, although one gets the impression that some people interpret the passage in that way. To follow Jesus fully, we must be able to see life as he sees it, we must have that "mind of Christ".

When we have the mind of Christ, then we can only see our lives in terms of loving and serving others and not in the pursuit of purely self-centered or even family-centered ambition. When we have the mind of Christ, the whole direction of our life changes. Our whole concept of happiness changes. Jesus is calling us not to a life of sacrifice and suffering, but rather to a life of total love and freedom. The person who can go to jail for his beliefs is freer and usually a lot happier than the one who is tied to the pursuit of material things, social position, pleasure, and the fear of pain.

"Denying oneself" is not a suppression of one's personality. It is rather to let go of oneself so that one can really find oneself.

This is what today's readings are saying, namely, that Jesus is calling us to where true success and happiness are. Maybe when we walk the way of Jesus there will be people who criticize us, think we are stupid, and even attack us. Yet those who have chosen the way of Jesus again and again confirm that their lives are full of freedom, happiness, and peace. Isn't that what we all would like to experience?

Register in the Parish Center on August 26/27 & September 2/3 after all Masses



National Eucharistic Revival - Year 2

Dear Parishioners,

Year 2 of the National Eucharistic Revival has begun! You may recall that a Diocese of Venice Eucharistic Congress was held in March - a number of our parishioners attended. The national revival will culminate in a National Eucharistic Congress in July 2024, to be held in Indianapolis and preceded by a 60 day National Eucharistic pilgrimage with 4 routes - one from each region. You can read more about these exciting events at https://www.eucharisticrevival.org/.

The focus of year 2 is Eucharistic Revival at the Parish level. I would like to make you aware of the activities that we have currently planned for St. Francis of Assisi during this year that support our desire for every parishioner to grow in their love and devotion to our Lord, present in the Blessed Sacrament.

- 1. Materials related to the Eucharist are being provided in our main entryway of the church. Some parishioners have donated books occasionally (first come, first serve) and one of our parishioners has stocked pamphlets on The Real Presence.
- 2. We will build an Adoration Chapel. You may recall that this project was approved prior to Hurricane Ian. Once the roof repairs are completed, we will proceed to create the Poor Clare Chapel.
- 3. We will participate in the Diocese of Venice Traveling Rosary Congress. This Congress will be held from October 7-13, 2023. This Year's theme is "To Jesus Through Mary". The Rosary Congress is held in response to Our Lady of Fatima's call to prayer and conversion. It includes Mass, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and the praying of the Rosary: for families, the Church, and peace in the world. Every parish that participates will schedule one 24-period during this week. We will begin our 24-hour period on Tuesday, October 10 with 8:15 a.m. Mass. After the celebration of Mass, the Eucharist will be exposed in the monstrance as we do each Tuesday. The exposition will continue until Mass on Wednesday at 8:15 a.m. Parishioners will pray the Rosary aloud before the exposed Blessed Sacrament once every hour. We will need to have at least 2-3 parishioners present for every hour of Eucharistic Adoration to ensure that the exposed Blessed Sacrament is never left unattended. Everyone is encouraged to attend and adore our Lord during this 24 hour period. More details will be shared, including how to sign up as an adorer, in the near future.

May God continue to bless you, your families, and our parish.




